### Civil List Act 1697

The **Civil List Act 1697** was an <u>Act</u> of the <u>Parliament of England</u> (9 Will. 3. c. 23). This was the first Act of Parliament to set the <u>Civil List</u>, although the custom had begun in 1689. The annual amount assigned to <u>King William III</u> and his household was £700,000, an amount that did not change until the beginning of the reign of <u>George III</u> in 1760.
